We would like to welcome new residents John & Kathleen Zilliox and Sean & Sarah Cady. They both live in Lake Jennie Estates development.



In past articles I have talked about the actions taken and results of studies by both the DNR and the Lake Improvement Association on Lake Jennie as a fishery. But where does the lake actually stand as a local fishery? The content in this article will not only be my opinion but the feedback of many fisherman and people related to the lake.

Lake Jennie has gone through many changes over the years from the “good ol days” to its present state. The general consensus is that the lake maintains its reputation as a great local fishery. Different attitudes and theories can be said for different species, but overall there is still something for everyone. It is safe to say that the lakes popularity has shifted to a bass hotbed amongst local lakes. The presence of many bass boats and several leagues and tournaments will attest to that.

Lake Jennie is one of the top local lakes to not only produce a personal best trophy but offers a great day of bass fishing catching fish of all sizes. Right now, there seems to be a healthy ecosystem for not only bass production but many different types of habitat and food source to support it.

Another popular target is Northern Pike. The buzz has spread and many anglers have been taking advantage of the spike in the Northern Pike's numbers on the lake. Hopefully the new regulations will lower the number of smaller fish and restore harmony in a healthy population in the Lake. Either way Northern Pike remain a popular game fish for anglers.

Panfish remain the species that a comeback is on the forefront. A healthy population of Sunfish and Crappie appear to be on the upswing.

The goal is to get the Lake back to healthy schools of both for anglers young and old to enjoy. The same can be said for Walleye pike as struggles are still being dealt with to get fish of all age classes present.

There are plenty of Walleyes in Lake Jennie to be caught but getting fish numbers in the slot limit is the goal of new stocking practices. Lake Jennie does remain a popular stop on many angler's schedule and does not really differ from any of our area lakes with highs and lows as relation to species. I think the traffic at the landing and number of boats on the lake the past few years shows the health of our great fishery!







